She received her Bachelor of Arts in psychology from Loyola University in New Orleans and her Master of Science in psychology from Divine Mercy University's Institute for the Psychological Sciences in Sterling, Virginia. Her diverse experience in primate behavior research, educational programming, and human services has brought her to the doorway of a new

venture, reaching out to youth and young adults in rural communities using novel approaches to dealing with social, emotional, and environmental stressors.

Ms. Phillippi is an advocate of equine-assisted growth and learning interventions because their effectiveness is well-documented in the literature and the connective experience between horse and human offers timely relief in a post-COVID world. The perceptive capacity of horses not only inspires present-minded awareness and agency amid a partnership of trust, but the fresh-air environment in which this engagement takes place naturally accommodates social distancing and health care recommendations. As a BCC, her goal is to develop youth and young adult mentorship programs that use equine-assisted strategies and outdoor encounters to facilitate adaptive coping and positive well-being. Additionally, she is interested in studying the psychospiritual benefits of the "power of presence" in working with horses, and she has plans to develop this research interest in her capacity as a BCC.
