## NBCC Foundation Awards Scholarship to Andrea E. Scott

years, Ms. Scott has worked in community mental health serving clients struggling with severe and persistent mental illness, clients struggling with acute addiction, and clients with a dual diagnosis in the residential, outpatient, psychosocial rehabilitation, and inpatient detoxification settings. She also provides outpatient counseling in a private practice setting, seeing individuals struggling with a wide variety of issues such as anxiety, depression, trauma, and substance use.

She will continue to work with these underserved client populations to develop independent living skills and recovery-focused practices to manage their illness and return successfully to their communities. Ms. Scott has implemented telehealth with her clients in private practice as well as community mental health and will utilize this award to continue bringing mental health services to those struggling with schizophrenia and other severe mental illnesses.
