

CCE Approved Clinical Supervisor (ACS) Training Award

Note: Requirements listed below apply to the 2022 application cycle. Dates and other eligibility requirements are subject to change for the 2023 application cycle.

In the spirit of promoting our efforts toward the Center for Credentialing & Education (CCE) Approved Clinical Supervisor (ACS) credential and maintaining the highest standards of clinical practice for the counseling profession, the NBCC Foundation in partnership with CCE offers the NBCC Foundation CCE ACS Training Award. The CCE ACS award advances the professional identity and development of counselors throughout the nation. Five awards in the amount of \$500 each are available.

Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Currently be board certified by holding the National Certified Counselor (NCC) credential, maintained with no ethical holds or missed payments for a minimum of one year.
- Must currently hold a master's degree or higher in a mental health field. Degrees must be from a postsecondary educational institution or program accredited by an accrediting agency or state approval agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education.
- Have extensive clinical experience in providing mental health or substance abuse counseling services.
- Commit to applying for the ACS credential within one year of the award.

CCE provides the funding for these awards, which the NBCC Foundation administers on CCE's behalf.
